

TOP OF THE GORGE FESTIVAL

14–16 JUNE 2019

This new adventure festival is a celebration of everything outdoors, with trail-running races, cycling events, climbing, camping, live music, guest speakers, food foraging, axe throwing and many others activities taking place across the weekend.

Anyone taking part in the Mendip Lakes and Lumps Ride gets free day entry to the festival after the Ride on Sunday 16 June.

In addition, if anyone would like to attend the whole weekend-long festival (from Friday 14 June to Sunday 16 June), Ride participants also qualify for a 30% discount as part of their Ride entry.

Participants will be sent a 'Welcome' email shortly after entering the Ride which will include an exclusive discount code - this can be used for tickets purchased in advance (camping, camper van, glamping) for them & family/friends, however it cannot be used on the day. On the Sunday itself, please note that spectators will need to pay for festival entry if they wish to join riders just for the day, and there are a couple of options for non-riders to gain entry:

1. Reduced-price day tickets can be purchased in advance online [HERE](#). (Full price will apply from 4 June, and full-price tickets will also be available on the gate).

Day ticket holders receive a non-transferable wristband granting full access to activities and entertainment taking place on site, including talks by inspirational speakers, unlimited use of the climbing wall and cave, slackline walking, campfire cooking sessions, archery, guided walks, food foraging, axe-throwing, live music and much more.

2. The National Trust festival organisers are also offering a special 'Spectator' wristband for the event, which can be obtained on the gate.

There's no set price for this but, to help cover the running costs of the festival, there is a suggested donation of £5 per adult, in return for which spectators will receive [raffle tickets](#). (The first prize is £10,000.)

The spectator wristband grants admission to the festival site & facilities such as toilets, as well as access to all the caterers, exhibitors and main stage until 5pm. However it **does not** include any of the activities open to people with a full day ticket (as listed above), or permit holders to stay after 5pm – to enjoy these experiences, spectators will need to pay to upgrade to a full day ticket.
